



Reducing Crime: Long-term Trend





- Crime Reduction over the last 10 years (2012/13 vs. 2003/04)
 30.7% reduction: 44368 fewer offences, from 144512 to 100144 offences
- Crime Reduction last year (2012/13 vs. 2011/12)4.7% reduction: 4933 fewer offences, from 105077 to 100144 offences
- Anti-Social Behaviour Reduction last year (2012/13 vs. 2011/12) 8.6% reduction: 5308 fewer incidents, from 61755 to 56447 offences


Solving Crime: Trends in Solved Crime



- Crime Solved Rate (2012/13 vs. 2011/12)
 - 2.8% point reduction: 27.0% of offences solved
- Crime Solved Rate (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012)
 - 3.8% point increase: 30.6% of offences solved
- Areas of Good Performance (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012)
 - Domestic Burglary: 9.0% point increase, 16.6% of offences solved
 - Robbery: 9.6% point increase, 21.0% of offences solved
 - Serious Violent Crime: 8.7% point increase, 37.7% of offences solved
 - Racially Aggravated Crime: 6.2% point increase, 44.6% of offences solved
- Area of Challenge
 - Other Burglary: 1.6% point decrease, 7.4% of offences solved

Public Satisfaction






■ Public Satisfaction (April – June 13)

- June 2013 best overall satisfaction results since April 2012
- Best Desk Based Investigation (DBI) results since introduction with 100% satisfaction from victims for treatment
- Improvement in 4 of 5 areas surveyed

Area of Focus: Domestic Burglary



Domestic Burglary offences are a concern for both the Force and members of the public. Last year saw a significant increase.



- Domestic Burglary Offence Increase (2012/13 vs. 2011/12)
 12.2% increase: 860 more offences, 7883 offences
- Domestic Burglary Reduction (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012) 0.5% reduction: 9 fewer offences, 1634 offences

Area of Focus: Personal Robbery

Areas of Good Performance (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012)

- Thurrock: 32.4% reduction, 37 to 25 offences

- Epping: 33.3% reduction, 39 to 26 offences

- Harlow: 22.6% reduction, 31 to 24 offences


Areas of Challenge (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012)

- Tendring: 133.3% increase, 15 to 35 offences

Area of Focus: Serious Sexual Crime



Following substantial media reporting on Operation Yewtree (Saville) there has been a substantial rise in the reports of serious sexual crime since the beginning of 2013/14.



- Serious Sexual Crime Offences (2012/13 vs. 2011/12)
 - 10.1% reduction: 121 fewer offences, 1078 offences
- Serious Sexual Crime Offences (April-June 2013 vs. April-June 2012)
 - 24.4% increase: 71 more offences, 362 offences
