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2.	Minutes of last meeting			
	Minutes of the January meeting were agreed.			
3.	Domestic Abuse Quarterly			
	The DA paper presented links to the recent HMIC reports which have been published. TS noted that the solved rate in 2015 is down compared to previous years; this is a concern which EP is addressing.  LW said that in Appendix 3 there were 172 cautions, at the out of court disposal panel approximately 70% have been returned to EP with concerns. LW asked how the feedback to EP was working. TS said that he had not heard about any concerns with DA cautions. The DCC said that he would look into.  SH noted the high number of high/medium risk case and said that there was a JDATT review on going. 	details of the one incident.  The MH noted that there were a number specialist detectives who were accredited within teams and that one of the challenges facing EP was the volume of cases.			
	NA noted that it was important that best practice from other forces was shared and learnt from. DCC said that EP had met with a number of other forces such as Derbyshire.			

	CF said that DHR Thematic report is being completed and that a final draft		
	was expected by mid-March.		
4.	Sexual Violence Quarterly		
	JG noted that there was an increase in rape and sexual violence however the rate of overall increase was slowing down. The overall increase is 12%. JG noted that historic solved rates are higher and that there has been a reduction in historical reporting.		
	JG said that the majority of offenders are white males aged 18 – 65 years, with 13% of offenders coming from BME backgrounds. This broadly mirrors the Essex demographic profile. There has been an increase in the number of young offenders. JG said that the increase was in part linked to improved recording and the classification of victims		
	It was noted that there are file champions across the force to ensure that that there is good file quality; this has now become part of officers CPD. MH said that better case management was a target for EP and also a challenge due to the tight timeframes. NA said that he could write to Jenny Hopkins regarding the CPS changes.		
	JG said that safeguarding forms part of the wider force plan. JG noted that in the last two months there had been 198 referrals to child social care, however many did not reach the require section 47 threshold. It was noted that this was a joint decision between different departments.		
5.	Performance Report		
	NA noted that a full year will have passed without domestic abuse data, SS said that EP was expecting the data to be available for the May report.		
	MH said that the Night Time Economy strategy has been refreshed and ACC Mason is leading on this work.		

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	Increase in crime of 9.9% of which over half is linked to violence without injury. CG asked what impact the additional 10,000 was having on resources. MH said that may of the violence without injury crimes can be dealt by desk investigations and do not require officers to be deployed.

	CH said that a Victims' Code Forum has now been arranged which is due to start in April.
