3.	Monthly Force Performance Reports:			
	A detailed report on Force performance for January 2015 was presented by			
	Wil Kennedy (WK), Head of Corporate Services, Essex Police.			
	Additional discussion was had around the following:			
	Domestic abuse			
	The force is continuing to convert a high number of reported incidents to crimes.			

Although the solved rate has decreased to 40.6% from 44.3% the previous year, productivity has increased with 324 more offences being detected. The % reduction being as a result of the increased reporting.			
Supporting victims of crime WK advised that a downward trend has been shown in the user satisfaction figures over the last three months, for all areas of satisfaction. The BME gap has increased to 8%, however the small numbers involved mean the figures are not statistically viable.			
The Confidence and Satisfaction board, chaired by ACC Mason are looking to address these concerns. Gwanwyn Mason (GM) attends this board. Reducing youth offending and re-offending in general The Integrated Offender Management (IOM) framework will be completed soon. Once introduced the monitoring programme will provide a better understanding of the figures.	provided to er ee		
Tackling consequences of Alcohol and Drug Abuse, and Mental Health issues			
WK requested a copy of the Drugs And Alcohol Team (DAAT) information provided to the OPCC and any other partnership data, which is used to inform the Police and Crime Panel quarterly performance reports.	08/15 – WK to be provided with most recent data from DAAT.	ТВ	
Road Safety Some road safety breakdown data is missing from the report due to inputting issues at Essex County Council (ECC). WK advised that when the new CRASH system is implemented Essex Police will be able to extract data directly.			
Improving Crime prevention WK advised that the Crime survey for England and Wales shows that the % of people agreeing that the police and local council are dealing with crime and ASB in this area is continuing to improve. The data for the last 12 months to September 2014 shows a value of 58.3% against 57.9% for the			

	same period the previous year.			
	Organisational Health The continuing upward trend for PCSO sickness was noted. The matter is to be raised at the next Resources scrutiny meeting.			
	Emergency response report (Action 76/14) The monitoring of Emergency response is being reviewed by ACC Wortley.			
4	Domestic Abuse Quarterly Report			
	The quarterly report was presented by Det,Ch.Insp. Tom Simons (TS).			
	TS reported that one third of victims do not support prosecution, however with the increased use of Body Worn Video (BWV) cameras it is expected that the number of prosecutions, without victim support, will rise. A benchmark has been established and data will be analysed in six months time.			
	TS advised that High Risk incidents attract a greater amount of work dependent on the level of safeguarding required. The investigation work undertaken by the JUNO teams is the same as for other categories of incidents.			
	Nationally there is a wide variance (11-60%) in the authorisation of Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (DVDS) applications. Essex Police have authorised 35% of applications made. In response to a question from LW as to the results of DVDS, TS advised this was not currently assessed and may require a form of performance framework.	09/15 To consider national information for learning. 	LW advised that going forward 30% of the cases reviewed by the Community Resolution and Caution disposal panel will be from Domestic Abuse related incidents. TS was invited to attend the panel.	10/15 TS to contact Jock Gibson (EP) for details.	TS	
	The EP Domestic Abuse action plan was discussed. TS provided an			

	update. Two actions are currently red.		
	LW stated that the Police and Crime Panel have requested regular updates regarding Domestic Abuse and asked if EP were agreeable to the sharing of the quarterly report with the PCP. Subject to a final review by TS this was agreed.	11/15 Domestic abuse quarterly reports to be shared with PCP.	OPCC
	WK advised that information relating to Domestic Homicide Reviews (DHR) is available on the force tracker.	12/15 CF to be provided with DHR information.	WK
	It was noted that the Thurrock Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) shares information relevant to the welfare of children across participant organisations, but information is not shared in domestic incidents involving adults only.		
	TS provided a response to the letter from HMIC providing feedback on the DA action plan. He advised information is currently provided to victims via a form taken from the DV1, but these forms will not exist once ATHENA is introduced. TS will look into future methods to provide information. SH suggested a link to the Victims gateway will be helpful.		
5	<b>Drugs Report</b> A report on Drugs was presented by Detective Sergeant. Paul Lopez (PL).		
	In addition to the quantities of drugs seized provided LW requested the breakdown for the number of seizures and the street value of these drugs. A profile of offenders charged with drug dealing was also requested, eg. large organised crime gangs, smaller groups or individuals.	13/15 OPCC to be provided details of number of drug seizures and street values, and a profile of offenders of drug dealing	PL
	In response to a query from SH regarding the types of crimes that were drug related WK advised that unless admitted by the offender, forming a link can be difficult and therefore this data was not available within the force. However the expansion of the drug testing on arrest could potentially further inform the links between drugs and certain crime types	14/15 OPCC to look at National research into drug related crime and drug testing on arrest data. 	LW queried the scale of use of Mephedrone to ensure the compliance of sex workers. SH highlighted the importance of the interface with public health in this matter.	15/15 LW to be provided with any information of the scale of use of Mephedrone.	PL
