1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval to allocate the Community Safety Fund Grant monies for 2013-14 to Community Safety Partnership's (CSP's).

2. Recommendations

2.1. To approve CSPs funding allocation from the Community Safety Fund Grant for continued activities.

3. Benefits of Proposal

3.1 This allows for the existing CSPs to ensure continuity of service across Essex, building on effective working relationships as well as supporting key priority areas of focus in the Police and Crime Plan.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1 For 2012-13 CSPs received funding from a variety of sources which has been as a result of historic decisions that have resulted in the amounts quoted in the table. These amounts correspond to the needs of the district across the county.
- 4.2 For 2012/13 CSPs received funding from Community Safety Fund allocations agreed by the Safer Essex Partnership and contributions agreed on a local basis with Essex police. The PCC has committed to continue to fund the same levels for each CSP for 2013/14.

5. Police and Crime Plan

5.1. In continuing to make this funding available CSPs have been asked to state how their activities fit with the PCC's eight priority areas of focus as set out in the Police and Crime Plan.

6.1 There are no operational implications.

7. Financial Implications

7.1 Total cost of Community Safety Grant monies for 2013-14 to CSPs is £309,727.



- 7.2 This amount is taken from £1.246m Community Safety Fund Grant monies. This is affordable and in line with the proposed funding for community safety activity set out in the Police and Crime Plan..
- 8. Legal Implications
- 8.1 Essex Police Standard Terms and Conditions apply and compliant to the Home Office Grant Agreement.
- 9. Staffing and other resource implications
- 9.1 There are no staffing issues. All CSP's are directly responsible for any staff employed to deliver projects.
- 9.2 There are potential resource implications for the PCC's office as the service and performance outcomes will have to be regularly monitored to ensure effective and efficient delivery of the Police and Crime Plan priorities.
- 9.3 The new functions of the PCC's office are a direct result of his ownership of the new Community Safety Fund and the related commissioning and monitoring mechanism that need to be put in place.
