1.0 Purpose of Report

To agree the charging basis for match-funded PCSOs for 2013/14.

2.0 Recommendations

Match-funders are charged on the basis of 95% of full costs inclusive of the revised full employers pension contribution for 2013/14 (£33,728 per FTE).

3.0 Benefits of Proposal

External partners contributions will keep pace with the rising real cost of PCSOs and Essex Police will not be exposed to additional cost/loss of income as a result.

4.0 Background and Proposal

PCSO charges for external partners have not been revised since the 2011/12 financial year. The average PCSO cost has risen in the interim due to incremental wage growth and increase employers pension contributions. Without an increase for 2013/14 the amount recovered from partners will reduce as an overall percentage and therefore increase the Essex Police contribution. In 2012/13, other public sector partners contributed a total of £623,000 towards the cost of PCSOs. As of 31/3/13, a total of 39 FTE PCSOs were part funded (50%) by parish councils or local authorities with a further 9 funded by commercial organisations (Lakeside & Stansted Airport Ltd).

6.0 Police Operational Implications

Match funded PCSOs represent approximately 10% of all PCSOs in force.

7.0 <u>Financial Implications</u>

There will be no net gain as a result of this change but it will mean that Essex Police budgets do not have to increase to accommodate an increased proportion of matchfunded PCSOs cost.

The NHP grant has been absorbed into the main grant from 2013/14 so there are no implications as far as grant funding is concerned.

8.0 Legal and Contractual Implications

Complies with Financial Regulation D.2.8. (Annual review of charges).

9.0 Staffing and Other Resource Implications

There is a potential for match-funders to withdraw from agreements as the charges increase. The force is however carrying significant vacancies so it will be relatively easy to accommodate a shrinking establishment without having to make any PCSOs redundant should any partners chose to withdraw funding.
