1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £7,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the NIF to Galleywood Parish Council, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation of the NIF grant to deliver an evening youth drop-in project in Galleywood.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 This project involves the set-up of an evening youth drop-in scheme. It is aimed primarily at those young people engaging in, or at risk of engaging in, crime & anti-social behaviour (ASB) and is being run in partnership with the local housing association (Chelmer Housing Partnership) and High school (Great Baddow High).
- 3.2 The aims of the project are;
- Reduce youth offending through engaging and working with young people involved in or at risk of becoming involved in crime & ASB
 - Provide young people with meaningful activities as an alternative to crime & ASB
 - Ensure families involved in crime & ASB or who display 'at risk' tendencies receive support as a family unit
 - Deliver early intervention to prevent young people becoming involved in drugs & alcohol, crime or ASB

- Strengthen links and utilise resources between key partners enabling a co-ordinated approach to tackling crime & ASB

4. Background and proposal

4.1 The application is supported by a proposal in the standard format.

4.2 This project is supported by match-funding of £7,000 from Galleywood Parish Council.

5. Police and Crime Plan

5.1 Supports priorities in the Police and Crime Plan as follows;

- Tackling the consequences of drug and alcohol abuse and mental health issues
- Reducing youth offending and re-offending
- Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
