1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £3,100 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2015-16 CSDF to Just Enough UK to run a series of Modern Day Slavery workshops in schools across Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of a Community Safety grant to deliver a series of 10 modern-day slavery workshops in schools across Essex.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. This project is for Just Enough UK to deliver workshops which educate children on modern day slavery to 10 schools in Essex. The project is intended to meet the PCC's aims of reducing hidden harm and improving crime prevention.
- 3.2. The project aims to teach young people that slavery exists in the UK today, what the 5 signs of slavery are and how to recognise & avoid risky situations. Young people are also taught that if they see something suspicious they can talk to their teacher and report suspicions to the Modern Slavery Helpline.

4. Background and proposal

4.1. The project seeks to deliver workshop content to 600 young people in schools across Essex, and to provide teachers with future lesson plans to follow-up the original workshop. Just Enough will evaluate the project to examine the extent to which it achieves its objectives of raising awareness and improving understanding of what constitutes modern slavery and what to do if young

people observe any suspicious activity that they believe may constitute slavery.

4.2. Just Enough UK has engaged with Essex County Council and will be approaching schools via the Health Schools network.

5. Police and Crime Plan

- 5.1. This proposal supports the PCC's vision and delivery of the following key areas of focus:
 - Reducing hidden harm
 - Improving crime prevention
 - Supporting victims of crime
 - Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
