## 1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the proposed allocation of Chelmsford City Council's Late Night Levy Fund which the PCC has agreed to re-invest into local Community Safety measures

## 3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 Chelmsford City Council agreed to adopt a Late Night Levy for Chelmsford in 2014. The levy was effective from 1 November 2014 and is payable on the annual renewal date of each licence which falls into the criteria defined by the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011
- 3.2 Chelmsford City Council Officers anticipate that a minimum of £35,000 will be raised by the levy, and the figure may be up to £50,000. The proposed allocation of this funding is outlined in the table below, which has been developed by the Chelmsford Late night Levy Task Group;
