1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £4,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the CSDF to Thurrock Youth Offending Service (YOS), whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation of the CSDF grant to Thurrock YOS to deliver a Firebreak course.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 Thurrock YOS are proposing to use the Firebreak initiative, delivered by Essex County Fire & Rescue Service. The course is primarily aimed at those engaging in negative behaviour but can also be for those who need a little support and direction in terms of interaction & communication skills.
- 3.2 The programme aims to promote a culture of safety and citizenship by providing a range of vital life skills whilst undertaking the various disciplines of the Fire Service.
- 3.3 Through the achievement of the above aims, Firebreak endeavours to;
- Instil a sense of self discipline, self-worth, independence and responsibility
 - Promote teamwork amongst the attendees
 - Encourage trainees to respect the differences between people
 - Confirm the benefits of worthwhile and fulfilling relationships

- Urge trainees to play an active and worthwhile role as a member of their community
- Ensure that the trainees make the most of their own and others potential.

4. Background and proposal

4.1 The Firebreak initiative provides a learning environment that combines practical skills and scenario based training, with classroom centred theory/discussion workshops. During the course, Firebreak students will take part in activities aimed at improving self-esteem, self-discipline and responsibility. This is achieved by employing fundamental Fire Service principals of leadership, teamwork and motivation.

- Reducing youth offending and youth re-offending
- Improving crime prevention
- Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
