1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £6,250 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2016-17 Community Safety Fund to Tendring CSP, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve funding of £6,250 to Tendring CSP as an additional contribution towards Tendring Domestic Homicide Reviews (DHRs).

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. This grant is made to support Tendring CSP to meet their statutory obligation to undertake a Domestic Homicide Review. The purpose of a DHR is to:
 - Establish what lessons are to be learned from the domestic homicide regarding the way in which local professionals and organisations work individually and together to safeguard victims;
 - Identify clearly what those lessons are both within and between agencies, how and within what timescales that they will be acted on, and what is expected to change as a result;
 - Apply these lessons to service responses for all domestic abuse victims and their children through intra and inter-agency working.
- 3.2. A DHR not only benefits the agencies involved enabling them to review and improve service responses to both victims of domestic homicide and the management of offenders. DHRs can assist families with the healing process and help satisfy the often expressed need to contribute to the prevention of other domestic homicides.

3.3. This funding covers the costs of a DHR Chair and report writer.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. Tendring CSP has 3 ongoing DHRs, which represents an exceptional and unforeseen demand on the CSP's finances.
- 4.2. This grant is in addition to £5k allocated to Tendring CSP from the 2015-16 Community Safety Development Fund to support ongoing DHRs
- 4.3. This grant benefits from match-funding from Tendring CSP.

5. Police and Crime Plan

- 5.1. Supports priorities in the Police and Crime Plan as follows;
 - Reducing domestic abuse and wider hidden harms
 - Improving Crime Prevention
 - Supporting victims of crime
 - Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
 - Increasing efficiency in policing through collaborative working and innovation
