## 1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £30,400 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Community Safety Fund (CSF) to Show Racism the Red Card (SRtRC), whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

#### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the Community Safety Fund (CSF) to Show Racism the Red Card to deliver workshops in schools that support young victims of hate crime.

#### 3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 Show Racism the Red Card will deliver preventative hate crime awareness workshops in Essex schools in order to;
  - give students an opportunity to raise questions or concerns about hate crime
  - empower students to embrace differences and accept themselves and one another
  - support victims of hate crime
  - improve understanding of racism and hate incidents
  - challenge stereotypes
  - Encourage safer and happier school environments
- 3.2 The project will be delivered to the 4 areas targeted as part of the Pathfinder pilot and 5 additional areas where it is felt the workshops would be beneficial

- 3.3 In place of Student Support sessions SRtRC would include time with the School Pastoral Care staff (train the trainer) reinforcing the messages and providing them with essential information on support for students and families in the local area. SRtRC would also organise a Teacher Training Day to provide awareness of the project and issues around 'hate' as well as regular teacher training events.
- 3.4 As part of this project SRtRC would look to coordinate a regional art or media competition to raise awareness of hate crime and to recognise the efforts of local schools, based upon their learning as part of the intervention.

### 4. Background and proposal

4.1 SRtRC delivered this intervention as a pilot project as part of the Victims' Pathfinder programme launched by the OPCC in 2014-15. This project was deemed to have achieved its stated outcomes of improving awareness, and encouraging greater reporting of, hate crime.
