Tendring Community Policing Team

- Manages and solves community policing issues, tackling anti-social behaviour, protecting vulnerable people, reducing drug and alcohol misuse, and reducing reoffending, working to priorities set by the Tendring Community Safety Hub.
- CPT has: 1 inspector; 2 sergeants; 9 constables; 9 PCSOs; 10 Special Constables; 1 Children & Young People's officer (shortly).
- Supported by 24/7 Local Policing Team

Community Safety Partnership (CSP) Priorities

- Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour
- Protecting Vulnerable People (Crime and Fear of Crime)
- Reducing drug and alcohol misuse
 within communities
- Reducing re-offending

Overview of all crime

- All Crime has increased by 9.6% (879 more offences)
- Violence without Injury has increased by 31.0% (449 more offences)
- Violence with Injury has increased by 14.5% (161 more offences)
- Anti-Social Behaviour has decreased by 4.3% (209 fewer incidents)
- Robbery has decreased by 14.9% (13 fewer offences)

Brightlingsea

- In 2015-16, there were 47 crimes of violence in Brightlingsea
- In Tendring, around 32% of all violent crime takes place in context of domestic abuse
- Analysis shows young people between the age of 11-15 years old are disproportionately involved in violent crime both as victims & perpetrators
- In 2015-16, two street robberies took place in Brightlingsea

Recent murder in Wivenhoe

- Paul Olney died in Wivenhoe on June 6, 2016
- Richard Waterhouse was charged with his murder on June 8, 2016
- A 37-year-old man was arrested and is currently on police bail
