- 1. Purpose of report**
To seek approval for the allocation of £17,195 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Community Safety Fund (CSF) to support development works in the Braintree and Uttlesford community safety hub
- 2. Recommendations**
Approve the allocation of £17,195 from the PCC Community Safety Hub fund to Essex Police for required redecoration, IT and renovation works to improve the community safety hub in Braintree Police station.
- 3. Benefits of Proposal**
This funding will create extra capacity to accommodate Essex Police and community safety partners within the existing community safety hub, enabling effective colocation and collaborative working arrangements.

Funding will cover the renovation of a current disused locker-room to be converted into office space, additional IT equipment, and redecoration of the existing office.

4. Background and proposal

In 2016 the PCC made a £120,000 fund available to CSPs across Essex to support the implementation of Community Safety Hubs in every Police district in the county.

This funding will support improved joint working arrangements between Essex Police and partner agencies.

5. Police and Crime Plan

The delivery of effective local community safety hubs is a key objective within the Police and crime plan and is an important element of delivering local, visible, accessible policing.

6. Police Operational Implications

Essex Police will co-locate with multi-agency partners within Braintree police station.

7. Financial Implications

The £17,195 cost of renovating the community safety hub at Braintree Police Station will be funded from the PCC Community Safety Budget for 2016/17. Specifically, from a commitment made in 2015/16 whereby £120,000 was accrued into 2016/17.

The operational and financial performance of the community safety hub will be subject to regular monitoring against the key objective within the Police and Crime Plan mentioned in section 5 above.

8. Legal Implications

There is a statutory requirement for PCC's to support Community Safety Partnerships.
