1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £10,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Community Safety Fund (CSF) to support the refurbishment of their existing office located on the ground floor of Clacton Police Station.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation £10,000 of the CSF grant to Tendring CSP via Essex Police as contribution towards funding the refurbishment and redecoration of the existing office.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. This funding will provide necessary infrastructure and refurbishment works to update Tendring CSP's existing office space within Clacton Police Station. The Community Safety Hub is a base for the Community Policing Team (CPT) and also acts as a location for partners to come in to and work from, in partnership with the CPT and other partners/agencies.
- 3.2. This funding will ensure the Hub space is welcoming for partners and to encourage a more Community Safety Partnership ethos by encompassing all partners and not focussing on the Police.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. In 2016 the PCC made a £120,000 fund available to CSPs across Essex to support the implementation of Community Safety Hubs in every Police district in the county. This funding will be allocated from that fund.
- 4.2. This project is supported by the local Community Safety partnership, District Council and Essex Police

5. Police and Crime Plan

- 5.1. The effective delivery of Community Safety Hubs is a specific deliverable within the Police and Crime Plan. This funding will help ensure the Tendring Hub continues to operate successfully
- 5.2. The funding supports the following priorities within the Police and Crime Plan;
 - Local, visible, accessible policing
 - Crack down on ASB
 - Tackle gangs and organised crime

6. Police Operational Implications

- 6.1. Essex Police will continue to co-locate with multi-agency partners in the Tendring Community Safety Hub

7. Financial Implications

- 7.1. The PCC would fund a £10,000 contribution to Essex Police

8. Legal Implications

- 8.1. The award of the grant is subject to the PCC's standard funding agreement

- 9.1. Essex Police will continue to co-locate with multi-agency partners in the Tendring Community Safety Hub
- 9.2. Hot-desk facilities will be made available to partner agencies to allow them to operate from the Community Safety Hub.
