1. Purpose of report

This proposal is to fund a replacement for the Covert Operations Source Management Operating System (COSMOS) with an advanced commercially available system. Law enforcement uses its powers of investigation, and covert authorities, to protect the public, preserve life and prevent and detect crime.

The use of covert techniques enhances Kent & Essex Police's ability to manage the highest risk areas of policing directly supporting the core values of each Force including safeguarding vulnerable people and detecting crime. Moving to a Commercial product will enable the forces to achieve the benefits of a platform product with a wider range of functionality and networking with the Eastern Region and share the costs of development of new and legislative requirement functionality and the mitigation of paper based application risk.

2. Recommendations

Approval of funding to replace the existing in house built CoSMos System with a more advanced commercially available system to ensure we are able to comply with The Investigatory Powers Act, which received Royal assent in November 2016, and will be subject to a phased implementation up to September 2018 necessitating a new workflow.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- Will maintain the compliance standards of both forces during IPCO inspections
- A replacement system would mean that the application for covert tactics would be available to all, rather than those who have been COSMoS trained and have Net C and COSMoS access.
- Will reduce the transportation risk of sensitive intelligence papers and travel costs
- Will provide an opportunity to deliver a centre of excellence model for covert policing

4. Background and proposal

The new Investigatory Powers bill comes into effect in September 2018; COSMOS will not be fit for purpose at this time. A replacement system is required as soon as possible to cope with the legislative changes that will be required. September would be desirable; however, this is not likely to be feasible.

5. Police and Crime Plan

The efficient management and administration of these covert techniques is essential to deliver the priorities of the Chief Constables and PCCs whilst improving public confidence in a sensitive area of policing subject to continued national scrutiny.

The covert management system handles about 200 applications a month covering the thematic areas of Modern Slavery, Child Sexual Exploitation, Dwelling Burglary, Gangs and Violence all key areas on the force control strategy and supports the fit against organised crime.
