To seek approval for an allocation of £39,707 in the form of crime and disorder reduction grants from the Community Safety Development Fund to the organisations listed in Section 3 below.

The three projects that successfully applied for funding in round two of the 2017-2018 Community Safety Development Fund are;

Street Pastors	£20,000	Street Pastors (SP) is designed to provide a Local and Visible reassuring presence in our local communities. Funding is required for the continuation of the Street Pastors County Coordinator. The Coordinator has been instrumental and is a key player in the setup of the Essex Wide Initiatives, extending SP's presence in new areas of Essex where requests have been put forward from either the Police or the Council like Rayleigh, Epping, Canvey, Maldon and Harwich	Protection Children and Vulnerable people from harm  Crack down on ASB
Essex Youth Build	£10,000	Essex Youth Build provide construction and employability training, monitoring and support to young people aged 14-19 from across Essex who are affect by various disadvantages including but not limited to being known to Youth offending Service , having special educational needs etc. The funding will be used to enable young people to obtain health & Safety in a construction environment qualification enabling them to gain paid work on one of the many building sites around Essex.	Tackle gangs and organised crime
Rainbow Services	£9,707	Rainbow Services works to alleviate the effects of disadvantage, deprivation and social exclusion through imaginative projects that support, enable and develop people and organisations and which stimulate beneficial change in the local community and beyond. The Recycling Workshop project is a contracted arrangement (with Sodexo) to provide a workplace environment for offenders who have received a Community Service Order through the courts in an environment that is, whilst punitive, also rehabilitative and constructive. The application to the CSDL fund focuses on developing the good work of the Recycling Workshop to take its rehabilitative effects to young people with risky behaviours and create a bridge between the experiences and learning of ex-offenders and the risk of offending that these young people are displaying.
