To propose arrangements for an interim Monitoring Officer for the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner.

#### 2. Recommendations

David Lawson Monitoring Officer for Thurrock Borough Council (TBC) Continues to provide the service of interim Monitoring Officer to the Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC) for the corporation sole of the Police and Crime Commissioner until the newly appointed Chief Executive and Monitoring Officer of the OPFCC commences on the 10<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

#### 3. Benefits of Proposal

David Lawson, Monitoring Officer for Thurrock Council, is currently providing the service of interim Monitoring Officer for the OPFCC following the departure of the Chief Executive and Monitoring Officer at the end of March 2018. This position has now been appointed to and the successful candidate will take up post on the 10<sup>th</sup> September 2018. David Lawson is familiar with the service and its requirements and or the purposes of continuity it is beneficial for this arrangement to continue until the 10<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

## 4. Background and proposal

The role of the monitoring officer is set out in Section 5 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989. The monitoring officer has 3 main responsibilities as set out in the Act:

- To report on matters they believe are, or may be, illegal or amount of maladministration;
- To be responsible for the conduct of the Commissioner, deputy Commissioner and the Office of the PFCC; and
- To be responsible for the operation, review and updating of the constitution.
