### 1. Purpose of report

To seek approval for an allocation of £35,223 in the form of crime and disorder reduction grants from the Community Safety Development Fund to the organisations listed in Section 3 below.

### 2. Recommendations

Approve the allocation of the CSDF grants to local organisations to deliver a variety of community safety projects that will support the objectives of the Police and Crime Plan.

### 3. Benefits of Proposal

The three projects that successfully applied for funding in round one of the 2018-2019 Community Safety Development Fund are;

Applicant	Cost	Project Description	Police and Crime Plan Priorities
Essex Youth Service	£10,000	Essex County Council Youth Service want to respond to the issue of County Lines by commissioning a drama piece targeting around 14,000 young people aged 11 – 19 (up to 25 for those with special educational needs (SEN)) across the county to raise awareness of organised crime. This proposal is based on the highly successful 'Chelsea's Choice' which was commissioned by Essex Youth Service in 2017. We are looking to use the same production company, AlterEgo, to deliver a 90 minute interactive drama production in schools.	Tackle gangs and organised crime
Out4Good	£18,223	Out4Good works with young people displaying anti-social behaviour, involved in gangs and criminal activity and high risk people that are already in the Criminal Justice System, are homeless, lead chaotic lives and have high support needs. Due to all this a lot of people won't work with them; but these are the people O4G works successfully with. We work in a holistic way meeting the client's individual needs. O4G provides intensive support which includes supporting the clients to apply for the right benefits, find them appropriate housing and support them to open bank accounts. We also support the clients at the doctors and Job Centre meetings etc. We also signpost them to the relevant agencies and support them in meetings if necessary e.g. Open Road the substance misuse agencies and the Mental Health Service etc.	Crack down on ASB  Tackle gangs and organised crime
Uttlesford Community Safety Partnership	£7,000	Liaising with Cambridgeshire Police, Hertfordshire Police, Essex Police and Suffolk Police (CHES) we are aware of the intelligence surrounding the use of the B1383, that the criminal fraternity use to travel north through Uttlesford District. The B1383 is a corridor that feeds roads to all of these counties, and Uttlesford suffers from cross border crime, including drug trafficking, rural crime and burglaries. This is a proposal to fund the link from an existing ANPR system to the Essex Police Control Room.	Tackle gangs and organised crime


