## 1. Purpose of report

1.1. To approve the allocation of £20,000 to Anglia Ruskin University for the evaluation of the Essex Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) perpetrator pathway (Home Office transformation fund) programme.

#### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of £20,000 from the 2018-19 Community Safety Fund to Anglia Ruskin University for the VAWG TF evaluation.

#### 3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. The Essex VAWG perpetrator pathway project was launched following a successful bid to the Home Office VAWG transformation fund in 2016. The programme introduces a new suite of interventions that supplement existing options for perpetrators and improve the clarity and consistency of pathways into appropriate interventions ensuring the partnership is responding earlier, identifying opportunities to prevent harm, and fully aligning to existing services. Interventions include:
  - The Bystander intervention initiative programme
  - A community-based perpetrator outreach programme
  - A male mentoring programme
  - A prison-based intervention
- 3.2. In order to measure the efficacy and value of this new model the PFCC is seeking a research partner to deliver the following;
  - An assessment of the impact of the overall VAWG perpetrator programme
  - An assessment of the extent to which stated individual interventions' deliverables have been attained

- An assessment of any financial benefits of the programme
- An assessment of the pathway's impact on the partnership and wider stakeholders, particularly the desire to make a systemic change and improve awareness and accessibility of perpetrator interventions
- A final report outlining findings, impact and outcomes, achievements, and lessons learned

#### 4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. This project is the recipient of £450,000 of Home Office funding over 3 years. As part of the application process the PFCC committed to finance and commission an independent evaluation of this programme.
- 4.2. This evaluation will inform the PFCC's future commissioning activity around perpetrator interventions post-April 2020.
- 4.3. The selection of Anglia Ruskin as the successful delivery partner followed a restricted procurement exercise supported by Essex Police procurement team.
- 4.4. Project is due to start in October 2018 and will take nine months.

#### 5. Police and Crime Plan

5.1. This evaluation supports the Police and Crime Plan priority to break the cycle of domestic abuse and protect children and vulnerable people from harm.
