

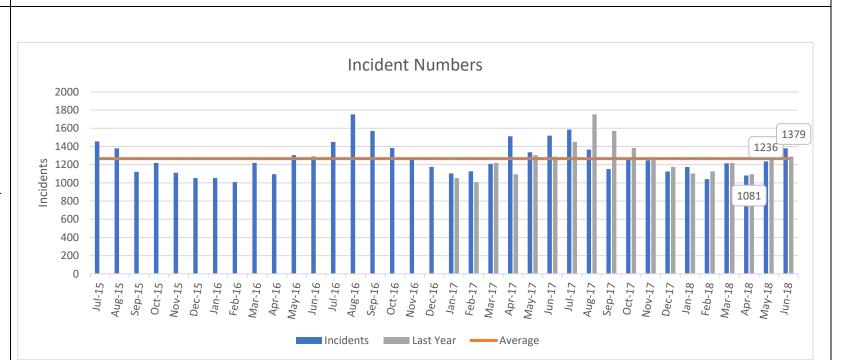

Incident Numbers

Incident numbers increased by 12% in June to 1379 (from 1236 last month). On a dayby-day calculation, June had on average 6 incidents more per day than May.

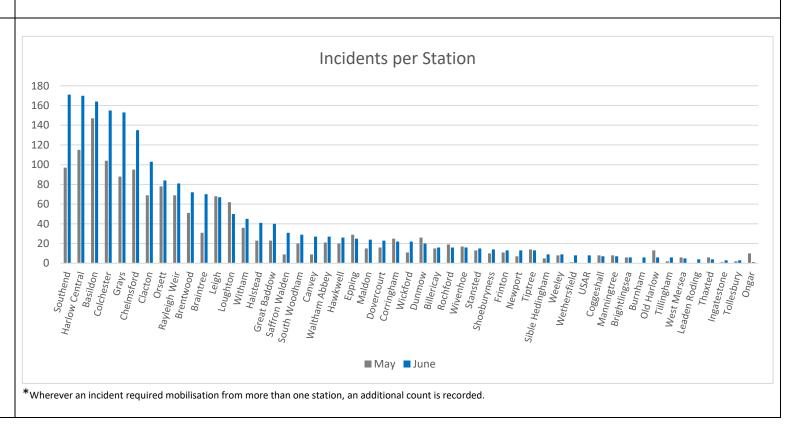




Incident attendance by Station

This report counts the number of times each station was mobilised during the month of June.*

Southend and Harlow Central were mobilised to the most incidents for the third consecutive month.



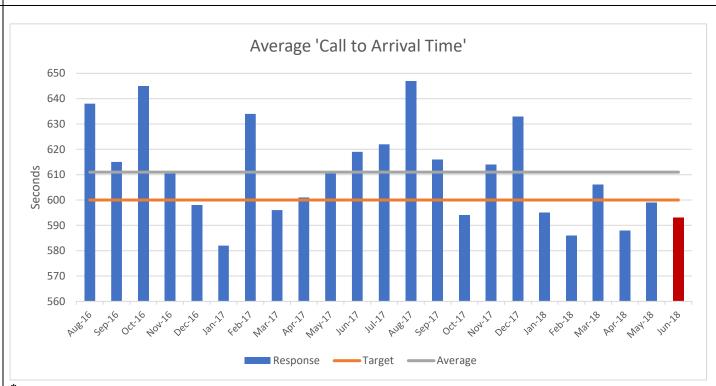


Response Time

The average response time in June was 9 minutes and 53 seconds.

This is 6 seconds faster than the previous month, and a significant improvement on June 2017 (10m 19s). This is the third month in a row that call to arrival time has been under target.

There was 1 incident that took longer than an hour to respond to and this has been excluded from June's calculation. If this had been included, the average response time would have been 9 minutes and 56 seconds.



^{*} Any incident that is managed locally at a Fire Station, (e.g. ring removal) and does not involve travel is not recorded.



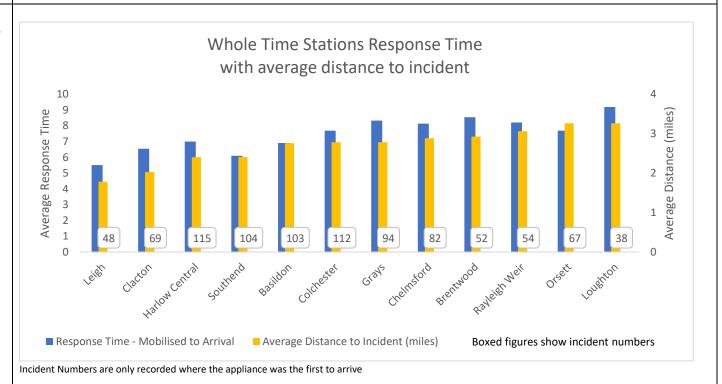
Response Times and Travel Distances by Station Whole Time

This chart shows average response times, from the time a call was received at Control, to the time a response unit arrived at the incident.

Leigh Station was the fastest to arrive at incident, and Southend station was in the top 2 for the 4th consecutive month.

9 of the 12 stations had average response times inside the 10-minute target, compared to 8 in May.

Grays, Brentwood and Loughton stations took the longest on average to attend incidents.

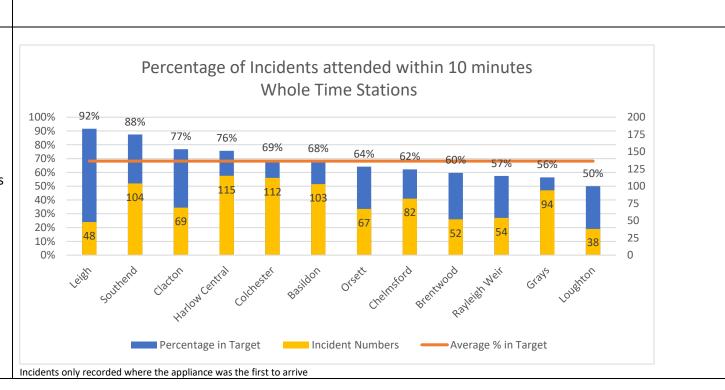




Percentage of Incidents attended within 10 Minutes

This chart shows the number of incidents at each station, and the percentage attended within 10 minutes.

Leigh Station for the second consecutive month attended the highest percentage of calls within 10 minutes. (44 of 48 incidents)



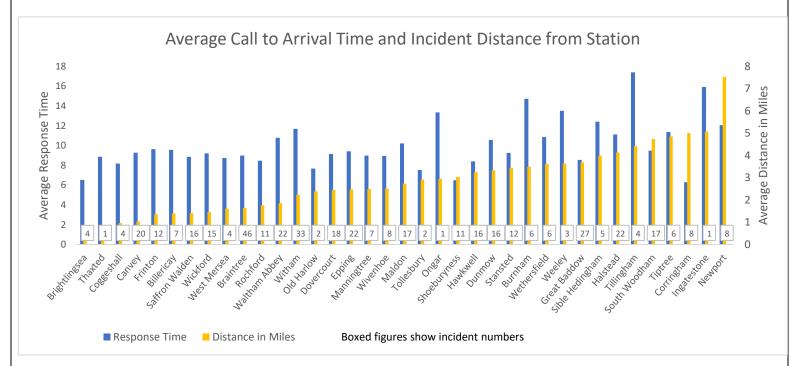


Response Times and Travel Distances by Station On-Call

Of the 38 On-Call stations, Corringham, Shoeburyness and Brightlingsea were on average fastest to arrive at incident in June.

9 of the stations had overall average response times inside the 10-minute target compared to 8 last month.

Tillingham and Ingatestone took the longest on average to attend an incident.



Incident Numbers are only recorded when the appliance was the first to arrive.

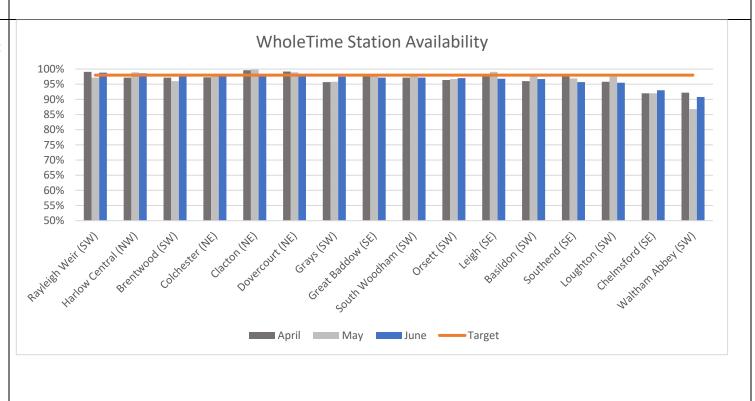
Leaden Roding does not feature, as this station did not have an appliance first to arrive at any incident in June.



Station Availability Whole Time / Day Crew

In June, 5 of the stations met the 98% availability target which was the same as May

Rayleigh Weir and Harlow Central had the highest availability whilst Chelmsford and Waltham Abbey had the lowest.



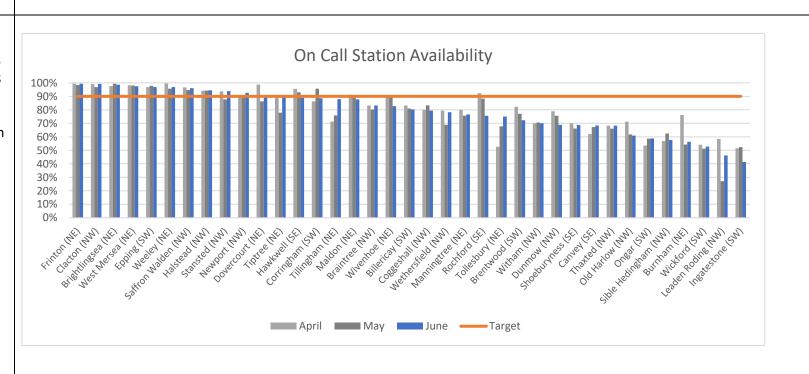


Station Availability On-Call

In June, 10 On-Call stations met the 90% target compared to 8 in May

The North East region took 3 of the top 4 places in terms of availability for the month.

Leaden Roding and Ingatestone had the lowest availability in the month.

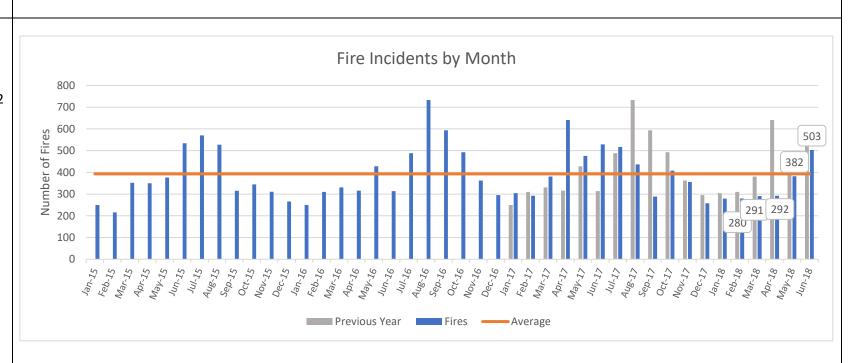




Number of Fires

There were 503 fires in June which is a significant increase on the 382 in May (32%).

This is however slightly lower than the 529 fires in June 2017.

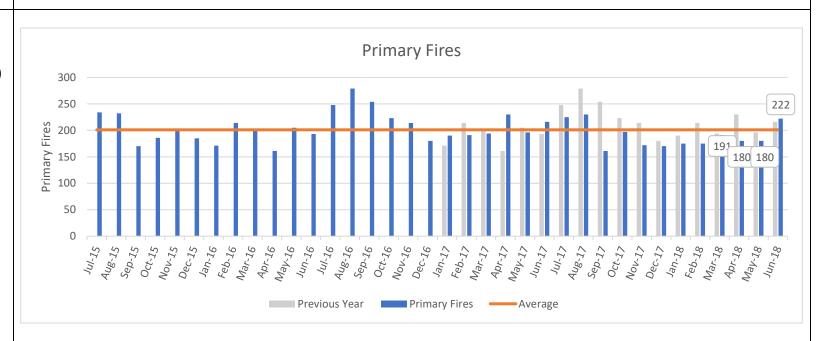




Primary Fires

Primary Fires have increased in June to 222 (from 180 in May)

This is the first time in 12 months that Primary Fires were higher than the equivalent month last year.



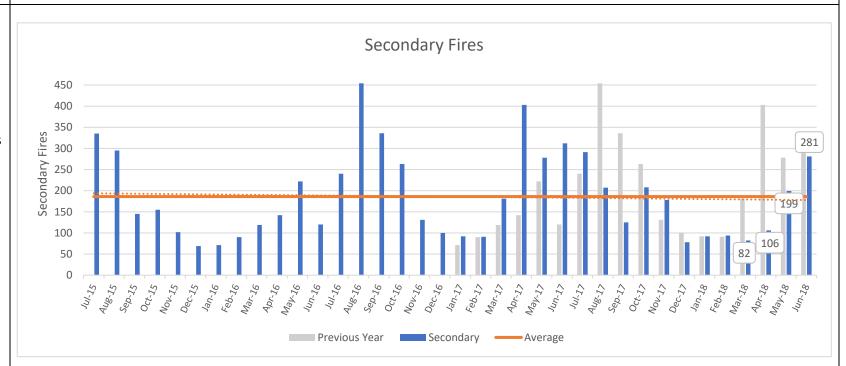
Primary Fire: Includes all fires in buildings, vehicles and most outdoor structures or any fire involving casualties, rescues or fires attended by five or more appliances.



Secondary Fires

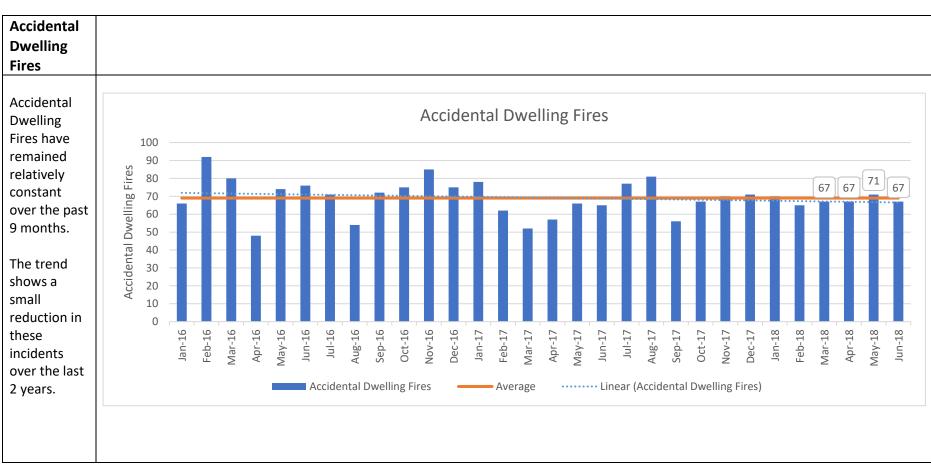
Secondary fires increased by 41% in June to 281 (from 199 last month, and 106 In April).

Despite this monthly increase, this represents a small decrease on June 2017.



Secondary Fire: An incident that did not occur at a Primary location, was not a chimney fire in an occupied building, did not involve casualties (otherwise categorised as a Primary incident) and was attended by four or fewer appliances (otherwise categorised as a Primary incident).



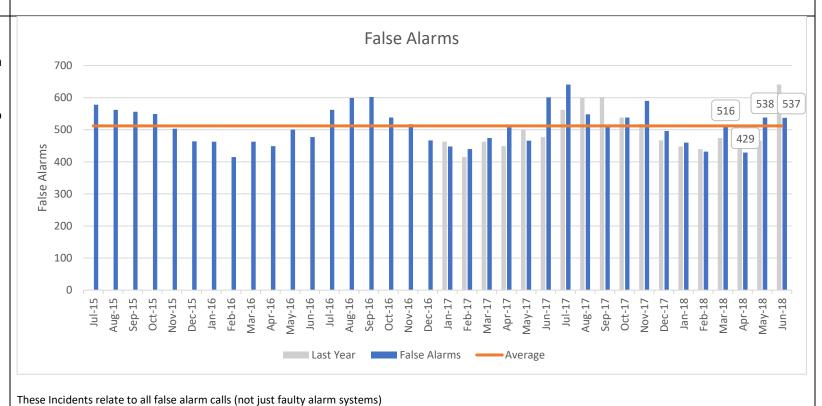




False Alarms

There was no real monthly change in number of False Alarms in June (537, compared to 538 in May)

This is however a 16% reduction on the same period last year.

Road Traffic Collisions by Station

In June a total of 103 Road Traffic Collisions were attended. This is a 10% increase on the 94 incidents in May.

These incidents usually take longer to respond to, and on average took 10 minutes and 38 seconds to attend. This is 33 seconds on average faster than last month.
