1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To approve the allocation of a grant from the 2018-19 Community Safety Fund to South Essex Rape and Incest Crisis Centre (SERICC) as a contribution towards their young person's conference.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation of £1,200 to SERICC as a contribution to their 2019 young person's conference.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. This funding will support the delivery of a young person's sexual abuse conference. The conference is being planned and delivered by young people that have experienced and been victims of sexual violence and abuse. The event is titled "REAL – Respect- Empathy- Awareness- Listen-end silence".
- 3.2. The cost is to fund two illustrators to attend, interpret and document the discussions for the duration of the Conference and to provide an innovative record of the event.
- 3.3. This event will offer an opportunity for young victims of abuse to share their experiences with a range of multi-agency attendees to improve the response to young people experiencing sexual abuse.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. SERICC is a member of the Essex Rape Crisis Partnership. ERCP delivers the countywide ISVA service and community-based support service for victims of sexual violence and abuse.

5. Police and Crime Plan

5.1. This grant ensures that victims are placed at the heart of the criminal justice process. This grant will ensure that vulnerable adults and children are protected from harm.

6.1. There are no direct operational implications of this decision for Essex Police.

7. Financial Implications

7.1. A one-off grant of £1,200 will be allocated to SERICC in the form of a crime and disorder grant from the PFCC's 2018-19 community safety fund.
