## 1. Purpose of the report

1.1. To approve the allocation of a second annual grant from the PFCC's 2018-19 Community Safety Fund to Tendring Citizens Advise Bureau (CAB)

#### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of £25,000 from the CSF to Tendring CAB to enable the continuation of the Tendring mental health hub project

#### 3. Benefits of the proposal

- 3.1. The Tendring Mental Health Hub has a number of key aims, which are to;
  - reduce health and wellbeing dependency
  - enhance employability of service users,
  - reduce social isolation, poverty, and vulnerability, and to
  - reintegrate service users into the community

In achieving these key aims it is intended that the service will provide a return on investment across public services.

3.2. The Hub is based within the Community Clothing Project located in Clacton-on-Sea which provides volunteering opportunities for people with mental ill health inclusive of a client drop in service. Activities are undertaken enabling those utilising the Mental Health Hub, if appropriate, to be provided safe and supported volunteering opportunities for people with mental ill health, reducing social isolation, aiming to improve resilience and health and wellbeing. The activities are to support progression for volunteers and day to day clients into mainstream volunteering, training and employment. Additional benefits flow into the community with residents benefiting from reduced poverty, increased physical

activity, take up of employment and improve health and wellbeing in line with promoting community cohesion.

- 3.3. In 2017/18 the Tendring Mental Health hub supported;
  - 272 new clients with ill mental health, providing a holistic assessment of their needs.
  - 150 of those clients had more than one appointment.
  - Supported clients through 825 issues through drop in, delivering 662 activities.
  - Made 431 onward referrals & signposts to other services.
  - Received 409 telephone calls.

### 4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. The project is match-funded by Essex County Council, North East Essex CCG and Tendring District Council. The total value of the project is £108,000 per annum.
- 4.2. It is estimated that the project has the potential to achieve crime-related cost benefits of £875,904 per annum based on the Manchester New Economy Model.
- 4.3. The original funding for this project was agreed via decision 0124/17 which indicatively committed the PFCC to provide funding for 3 years and stated that individual decision sheets would be raised for funding allocations in 2018-19 and 2019-20.
