1. Purpose of report

To seek approval for the allocation of up to £10,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Community Safety Development Fund to support communication activity by raising awareness of the fund and to share the successes of community projects. Funding will be allocated to Making Words Work! a designated copywriter to support development of communication and media material following successful CSDF projects and Wire Frame Media to create short films in order to raise awareness of the CSDF.

2. Recommendations

Approve the allocation of up to £10,000 from the Community Safety Development Fund grant to allocate to **a** Making Words Work! an independent copywriter and Wire Frame Media film and media production.

3. Benefits of Proposal

The Community Safety Development Fund is a fund used to support community projects that support the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan. Utilising the copywriter and film production organisation allows the PFCC to provide further support to the projects publicly and provide public awareness to their organisations.

Transparency is a key ethos within the office of PFCC. Whilst the PFCC publishes all decisions, the additional communication activity allows the PFCC to further demonstrate the outcomes of projects that are funded and share these with others.

The stories will also help to generate further applications and publicity to the fund encouraging other community projects to apply.

4. Background and proposal

The Community Safety Development Fund is to support local voluntary and community safety groups to deliver effective approaches to preventing and tackling crime and anti-social behaviour in Essex.

The office of the PFCC would like to allocate £10,000 to support communication activity by raising awareness of the fund and to share the successes of community projects. £5000 will be used as a retainer for Making Words Work! a copywriter who will be able to go and visit successful CSDF projects throughout the year. We can then use these stories to share publicly and demonstrate the value of the Fund. £5000 will also be provided to Wire Frame Productions to produce short films about the CSDF. The films then can be used on social media and websites to give a visual awareness of the CSDF. The ambition is to utilise the films across the year to target geographic areas where we are not seeing high volumes of applications.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

The alternative options considered were

- To utilise the PFCC communications team. The PFCC communications teams were engaged and consulted in this proposal. Visiting community projects is resource intensive and would require additional capacity in order to complete. Some of the communications activity proposed is a specialism and requires external support in order to create.
- Not to do any communication activity against the CSDF this is not a viable option as the fund's aim is for organisations to apply for funding to support Police and Crime Plan priorities. If there was no promotion or awareness activity, there is a high risk that the fund would not receive applications, the applications would be of low quality and we would not see strong outcomes against the plan.

6. Police and Crime Plan

All decisions taken by the PFCC are open and transparent. Increasing communication activity allows the PFCC to continue to provide further transparency to the decisions that have been made by sharing details of funded programmes that support Police and Crime Plan priorities.
