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1. Purpose of report

To seek approval for the allocation of £9,870 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2019-20 Community Safety Fund to The London Bus Theatre Company. The activities of Theatre Company will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

To seek approval for the allocation of £9,870 to The London Bus Theatre Company which will deliver a young people led, sustainable, quality short film and life skills drama project

3. Benefits of Proposal

The programme will aim to:

- Reduce antisocial behaviour on Canvey Island by engaging young people in a drama club.
- Create a film to encourage young people to remain safe, which will include themes of antisocial behaviour, drugs and criminal exploitation.
 The film will be created by young people from Canvey Island
- Improve young people's feeling of safety within the community
- Give young people the opportunity to increase engagement with community activities

4. Background and proposal

The London Bus Theatre Company plans to deliver a young people led, sustainable, quality short film and life skills drama project over the next year for young people aged 12 - 26 from Canvey Island. The project will boost confidence, raise aspirations, and develop a wide range of transferable life skills that will be used beyond the life of the project. The project will enable the community to develop happier and stronger relationships with each other by tackling youth gang crime, antisocial behaviour and deprivation. The activities planned are:

- A short film for social media developed and delivered by local young people aged 12-16. Young people will be involved in the project from start to finish. They will be involved with the film from script development to production planning, delivery and promotion.
- A free monthly confidence building and life skills drama club.
 London Bus Theatre Company will facilitate one day a month
 training sessions at weekends. Accredited drama school trained
 workshop leaders to ensure the highest industry standard will
 provide the training. The sessions will consist of confidence
 building games and team building exercises, voice and posture,
 stage combat, role-play and improvisation, job interview
 techniques, text work, sight-reading and acting to camera. The club
 will feed into the feature film project. This part of the project is
 being funded by Awards for All, Big Lottery.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

The alternative option is not to support this project. The London Bus Theatre Company has already secured funding from Awards for All (Big Lottery) for the drama training. Additional funding from the PFCC will support and improve the impact of this training which in turn supports the Police and Crime Plan priorities. Alternatively The London Bus Theatre Company will have to seek funding elsewhere which increases the risk of the project not being able to go ahead and risks the ability to achieve desired outcomes.

6. Police and Crime Plan

The London Bus Theatre Company will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan specifically priority 2 (crack down on anti-social behaviour) and priority 6 (protecting children and vulnerable people from harm).
