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1. Purpose of report

To seek approval for the allocation of £2,587.50 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2019-20 Community Safety Fund to The Medaille Trust, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex. This is a 50% contribution along with Kent PCC.

2. Recommendations

To seek approval for the allocation of £2,587.50 to Kent Police for The Medaille Trust to continue to provide a safe house for victims of modern slavery in Essex.

3. Benefits of Proposal

The safe house provides safeguarding and appropriate immediate support to victims, and will prevent re-victimisation of those identified as being trafficked or experiencing modern slavery in Essex.

Last year the Safe House received and supported 22 referrals of victims of human trafficking and modern slavery.

4. Background and proposal

The Medaille Trust operates a safe house for victims of modern slavery to be accommodated prior to their formal acceptance into the National Referral Mechanism, and supports the nationally commissioned Salvation Army support contract.

The Safe House was initiated back in 2016 (decision sheet 088/16) following the identification of a gap in the provision of immediate support once victims are identified and before they are picked up by the Salvation Army contract, which may take up to 5 days. This resource is shared with Kent Police.

Funding of £2,587.50 will cover room costs, staff support, toiletries, clothes, food, and money for personal items as and when required.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

The alternative option that was rejected is to decline funding support to The Medaille Trust. The Police and Crime Plan commits to supporting victims of human trafficking and modern slavery. The Safe House does this by safeguarding victims once identified.

6. Police and Crime Plan

The Medaille Trust contributes to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan specifically priority 5 (tackle gangs and organised crime).

8. Financial Implications

The PFCC will fund a one off contribution of £2,587.50 to Kent Police from the 2019-20 Community Safety Fund for The Medaille Trust to deliver the Modern Slavery Safe House.
