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1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £1,350 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2019-20 Community Safety Fund to Viewpoint Marketing for the design and publication of the 2019-20 Southend, Essex and Thurrock (SET) Domestic Abuse (DA) annual report.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. To provide a grant of £1,350 from the 2019-20 Community Safety Fund for the design and publication of the SETDA annual report.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. The SETDA annual report will provide a summary of the work of the domestic abuse partnership throughout the previous year, giving partners and stakeholders a clear understanding of activity and progress.
- 3.2. The partnership will use the annual report to evidence activity against the SETDA strategy, which is due to be refreshed in 2020.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1. The SETDA partnership is governed by the strategic domestic abuse board, chaired by the Deputy PFCC. The partnership works to the SETDA strategy, which was developed and published in 2015 as a 5-year strategy with a number of high-level outcomes;
 - Young people enjoy healthy relationships
 - Victims (Adults and Children) and those at risk of experiencing domestic abuse feel and are safe
 - Victims (Adults and Children) are able to recover and move on to live independently
 - Perpetrators are prevented from causing physical and emotional harm

- Communities have a greater awareness of what an abusive relationship is and how to report it and as a consequence feel safer

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

- 5.1. The PFCC has the option not to fund the design and publication of this report, however it will promote the ongoing work of the SETDA partnership which helps to deliver against the priorities within the Police and Crime Plan. The PFCC has an established relationship and contractual arrangements in place with Viewpoint Marketing.

6. Police and Crime Plan

- 6.1. This project supports the police and crime plan priorities to protect children and vulnerable people from harm and to break the cycle of domestic abuse.

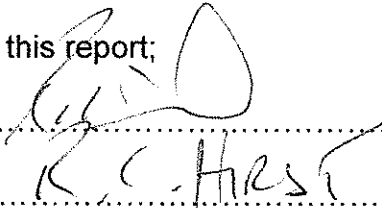
