1. Purpose of the report

To receive approval from the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (PFCC) of the Service's Integrated Risk Management Plan (IRMP) 2020-24 (attached).

2. Recommendation

That the PFCC approves the IRMP 2020-24 (attached)

3. Benefits of the proposal

The IRMP sets out to identify the risks in the county of Essex and to highlight the approach the Service will take to mitigate those risks in line with the Fire and Rescue National Framework and the Service's Fire and Rescue Plan.

4. Background and proposal

The Service is required to have an IRMP as part of the Fire and Rescue National Framework.

The Service is required to consult with the Essex communities in producing its IRMP. An initial consultation took place in 2019, whereby views were sought on seven key proposals. Those proposals, combined with feedback from the 2019 consultation, were then used to develop a draft IRMP 2020–2024. The consultation on the draft plan finished in March. Following the consultation process, the purpose of this paper is to obtain approval of the IRMP 2020-24.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

The Service's current IRMP finishes in 2020. As the IRMP is a legal requirement, no other options are considered.

6. Strategic priorities

These are set out in the IRMP (attached)

7. Operational implications

The IRMP has been through a formal consultation process with the Service's staff, their representative bodies, Essex communities and key partner agencies.

8. Financial implications

The Service's IRMP will be delivered within the Service's current budget and mediumterm financial plan. Any additional resources required will be subject to approval of an additional business case.

9. Legal implications

Under the Fire and Rescue National Framework, the Service is required to produce an Integrated Risk Management Plan.
