1. Purpose of the report

To approve the payment of Emergency Services Mobile Communications Programme (ESMCP) funding totalling £967,118.46 to Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fire Authority as acting funding custodians of the ESMCP project.

2. Recommendations

The Commissioner is recommended to approve the payment of £967,118.46 EMSCP funding to Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fire Authority (see Appendix 1).

3. Benefits of the proposal

To allow regional distribution to continue of the ESMCP funding.

4. Background and proposal

The Emergency Services Mobile Communications Programme (ESMCP) is a cross government project to deliver the new Emergency Services Network and retire Airwave. Funding has been collected by Essex County Fire and Rescue Service from the Home Office and distributed across the region. Karl Edwards (Director of Corporate Services) is the Service's Senior Responsible Owner (SRO), and Matthew Stalker (Portfolio and Programme Manager) is the ESMCP Regional Project Manager for Essex.

The ESMCP includes 107 emergency services and 12 other national organisations, such as the Border Force. It will have over 300,000 users, cover over 538,000km and be used in over 45,000 vehicles. Essex County Fire and Rescue Service intends to transition to the ESN in 2023.

This funding has accumulated from several Section 31 grants since 2015 and contributes towards the cost of ESMCP Programme Managers and other directly attributable expenses. Its governance and dispersion are directed by the East of England Regional Transition Group. Every region has an RTG designed to collaboratively manage the transition from Airwave to ESN. Each regional group has links to the national programme and other regional groups within the 3ES, such as the 7 Forces Police Collaboration Group.

The decision to transfer the custodianship of regional funds is consistent with how the budget has been managed in the past. This budget has always been managed by the Authority that Chairs the Regional Transition Group. Initially, this was chaired by Norfolk and then funds were transferred to Essex when ACFO Matt Furber chaired the group.

Since his retirement, the group has been chaired by Area Manager Jon Anderson from Cambridgeshire, which is why we are now seeking to transfer the funds to them. Essex County Fire and Rescue Service will continue to have access and draw down from this grant once the custodianship has transferred to Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service.

The SROs for each Service have been asked to approve the transition of funds from Essex to Cambridgeshire and the proposal has been supported unanimously.

The balance carried forward as of 31st March 2020 was agreed by the Home Office as £967,118.46.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

Keeping custodianship of the funding was not considered, as the normal practice is to transfer control of the funding to the chair of the Regional Transition Group.

6. Strategic priorities

The balance needs to be transferred to Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fire Authority to allow Essex County Fire and Rescue Service to continue to claim costs from the funding pool. This will ensure that we can make best use our resources, which is aligned to our priorities within the Fire and Rescue Plan.

7. Operational implications

Operational cashflow implications have been considered in Section 8.

8. Financial implications

The cashflow implications of the transfer have been fully considered. Essex County Fire and Rescue Service has sufficient cash reserves to meet all obligations for the foreseeable future.

This funding is held in the Essex County Fire and Rescue Service's balance sheet within 'Grants Received in Advance', therefore there will be no impact on outturn.

9. Legal implications

Essex County Fire and Rescue Service does not have the legal right to hold this funding. It is obliged to make the transfer to Cambridgeshire.
