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### 1. Executive Summary

This report seeks to gain agreement for the payment of £4,852 for the printing of the Commissioner's Precept Leaflet for 2021-2022 and 2020-2021 to Southend-on-Sea City Council. Both leaflets have already been printed and distributed and were originally budgeted for within the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 PFCC office budget. However, these payments were not made as no invoice was received and the expenditure was not accrued so the cost will now need to come out of the 2021-2022 PFCC's budget and will therefore reduce the forecast underspend by £4,852.

#### 2. Recommendations

The PFCC agrees to pay Southend on Sea City Council invoice for the £4,852 costs they have incurred for printing and distributing the 2021-22 and 2020-21 precept leaflet.

### 3. Background to the Proposal

A leaflet is developed each year setting out the cost of Essex Police and Essex County Fire and Rescue Service and what this public investment in the two services is spent on. The PFCC's office partner with local councils to print and distribute the leaflets. This works alongside the system that each council has in place to provide residents with their tax bills.

Southend on Sea City Council has supported this work for several years, however, having reviewed the process this year it became clear that the cost incurred by the council for the 2021-2022 and 2020-21 leaflet had not been passed on to the Commissioner.

### 4. Proposal and Associated Benefits

By making this decision, the Commissioner will pay the money owed to Southend on Sea City Council for the costs incurred in previous years and maintain an ongoing, effective relationship with them.

## 5. Options Analysis

It might be possible for the PFCC not to pay these invoices, however the amount is owed to Southend on Sea City Council and it would be likely adversely impact our partnership work going forward.

#### 6. Consultation and Engagement

We have discussed this proposal with the Chief Executive and S151 officer.

#### 7. Strategic Links

Development and delivery of the precept leaflet directly supports our engagement with the public and our long-term strategic drive to prevent crime by investing in Essex Police, building stronger relations with the public and preventing crime.

#### 8. Police operational implications

There are no operational policing implications.

### 9. Financial implications

The allocated funding in 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 was not paid as no invoice was received and the expenditure was not accrued, therefore the cost for these leaflets will now need be met from the 2021-2022 PFCC budget. The cost is £4,852 and will reduce the carry forward underspend by £4,852.

#### 10. Legal implications

There are no adverse legal implications from this decision. However, the legal implications of not making this decision could lead to action from Southend on Sea City Council to recover the debt which we do owe to them.
