1. Purpose of the report

To gain the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner's (PFCC) approval of the publication of the Annual Report and Statement of Assurance 2021-2022.

3. Benefits of the proposal

The publication of the Annual Report and Statement of Assurance 2021-2022 provides valuable public information about the performance of the Service over the financial year. It ensures that performance data and information is in the public domain and has been scrutinised by the Police, Fire and Crime Panel. The publication also ensures the PFCC complies with their statutory obligation to produce a Statement of Assurance and Annual Report.

4. Background and proposal

The Fire and Rescue National Framework for England sets out the priorities and objectives for fire and rescue authorities in connection with the discharge of their functions. Every Fire and Rescue Authority must publish an annual statement of assurance of compliance with the Framework.

For PCC FRAs such as Essex, this statement is subject to scrutiny by the Police, Fire and Crime Panel and is called the 'Fire and Rescue Statement of Assurance'.

The statement outlines the way the authority and its fire and rescue service has had regard – in the period covered by the document – to the National Framework, the Integrated Risk Management Plan and to any strategic plan prepared by the authority for that period (most notably the Fire and Rescue Plan). The authority must also provide assurance to their community and to government on financial, governance and operational matters. The report uses annual performance and data that has already been approved by the Service Leadership Team and OPFCC.

5. Alternative options considered and rejected

A variety of presentational options were considered, and the current format was used following careful consideration of what would be most accessible and transparent for the public and previous feedback from the Police, Fire and Crime Panel.

This document reports on the progress of the Service against their statutory obligations and the priorities set out within the Fire and Rescue Plan and Integrated Risk Management Plan.
