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1. Executive Summary

The National Rural Crime Network (The Network) is working to see greater recognition and understanding of the problems and impact of crime in rural areas so more can be done to keep people safer. Essex PFCC has been an active member of the Network for many years and the Deputy Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner is currently a board member of the network.

2. Recommendations

The Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner agrees to pay £3,000 for continued members of the National Rural Crime Network.

3. Background to the Proposal

The National Rural Crime Network was set up to raise awareness, share best practice and tackle rural crime and enhance community safety in rural areas. The Network is concerned with all crime and anti-social behaviour occurring in rural areas. This includes problems typically associated with the countryside such as wildlife and heritage crime, farm equipment and hare coursing but also drug dealing, domestic abuse and burglary, which very often present different demands when they happen in rural areas than they do when they occur in cities and urban areas.

The PFCC for Essex has been an active part of the Rural Crime Network and has supported their activity including rural crime surveys and the publication of research into the cost of rural crime across the county.

4. Proposal and Associated Benefits

Continued membership of the Network will provide the PFCC with an established national network to work alongside to improve the visibility and understanding of rural crime nationally. This aligns closely to the PFCC's priority around tackling rural crime in Essex, which is in their police and crime plan.

As the Deputy Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner is a board member for the network the PFCC has significant influence over the activity and focus of the network helping them gain greater strategic value from our ongoing membership.

5. Options Analysis

The PFCC could choose not to continue with their membership, though this is not recommended as it would make it much harder for the PFCC to deliver against their priorities.

6. Consultation and Engagement

This proposal has been discussed at the PFCC's Management Team Meeting.

7. Strategic Links

This decision would support the commissioner's priority to tackle crime in rural and isolated areas.

8. Police operational implications

There are no operational policing implications for this decision.

9. Financial implications

The cost of this subscription is £3,000 for 2022-23. This is an increase from £2,000 in 2022-23. This has historically been funded from the PFCC's Communications and Engagement Budget, so it is proposed that this will continue to be funded from that budget.

10. Legal implications

There are no legal implications from this decision.

11. Staffing implications

There are no staffing implications from this decision.

12. Equality, Diversity and Inclusion implications

Membership of this group provides access to survey results focused rural communities. This gives the PFCC a good data source to better understand the impact of crime and community safety activity on rural communities and how they can better understand how to support them.
