Reason for Grant Variation	The Authority offers additional funding to the Recipient ("Additional Funding") as follows:  Sexual Violence Local Commissioning Test Funding for 1st April 2023 – 31st March 2024 only The purpose of this Additional Funding is to provide or commission support services for victims of sexual violence.  Male Rape Support Service Funding ("MRSSF") for 1st April 2023 – 31st July 2023 only The purpose of this extension of Additional Funding is to provide or commission sexual violence services to address the specific needs of male victims who have experienced rape and sexual abuse at any point in their life, including recent and non-recent child sexual abuse.		
Revised Grant Offer	The value of the Additional Funding is £693,732.92  This comprises of: £667,959.59 SV Local Commissioning Test Funding. £25,773.33 Male Rape Support Services Fund.  This increases the Grant funding offered for 2023-2024 to £2,307,500.33  The Additional Funding may only be used for the provision of the Activities mentioned in Grant Agreement and Grant Addendum Notices 1 and 2.

- c. Enable services to demonstrate **effective impact measurement**, to ensure interventions are outcome-focussed for victims-survivors, and also inform broader government policy making.
- d. Strengthen organisational capacity and capability, with a view to long-term sustainability of community-based sexual violence support service providers focusing on strategic development, including an organisations' ability to diversify funding streams.

Pursuant to paragraph 5 in the Agreement, Annex 11 is added, as follows:

# Payment Arrangements

The Authority will only pay the Additional Funding to the Recipient in respect of Eligible Expenditure incurred by the Recipient to deliver the Activities insofar as they address the specific needs of Victims of Crime.

Apart from the changes set out above, the Agreement remains in full force and effect. Terms defined in the Agreement have the same meaning when used in this Grant Addendum Notice, unless defined otherwise.

This Grant Addendum Notice will be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of England and Wales and the Parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English and Welsh courts.

In considering whether to accept this Additional Funding, you should note that the Authority must be satisfied that your organisation has sufficient demand to ensure the Additional Funding can be spent on the Activities by the end of the Funding Period. Paragraph 6.22 of the Agreement states that the Recipient may not retain any portion of the Grant that has not been used by the end of the Funding Period without the Authority's written permission. If you are in any doubt about meeting these conditions you should consult the Authority before accepting.

Please confirm that you would like to accept the Additional Funding by returning a signed copy of this Grant Addendum Notice to <u>victimservicescommissioning@justice.gov.uk</u> by no later than 9 June 2023 (electronic copies are acceptable and are preferred).

The Parties acknowledge and agree that signature of this Grant Addendum Notice by the Recipient constitutes a Grant Claim for the Additional Funding.

Upon receipt, you will be issued with a copy of the Grant Addendum Notice signed on behalf of the Authority. The amendments shall take effect from the date that this Grant Addendum Notice is signed on behalf of the Authority.
