Reason for Grant Variation	Additional Funding The Authority offers additional formula-based ('core') grant funding to the Recipient with a value of £73,633.19 ("Additional Funding") for the financial year 2023/24 only. The purpose of this Additional Funding is to provide or commission dedicated emotional and practical support services for Victims of Crime to help them cope and, as far as possible recover from the effects of crime.		
Revised Grant Offer	The additional formula-based ('core') grant funding is: £73,633.19. This will increase the formula-based ('core') grant for Financial Year 2023/24 to £2,223,446.27. The additional funding may only be used for the provision of the Activities set out in Annex 2 of the Formula-Based Grant Funding Agreement.		
Grant Funding Period	1 st April 2023 to 31 st March 2024.		

This variation makes provision for additional formula-based ('core') grant funding for the Financial Year 2023/24 and, pursuant to paragraph 5 in the Agreement, amends Annex 3 (Payment Schedule).

Summary of Grant Variation

Payment Arrangements

The Authority will only pay the additional funding to the Recipient in respect of Eligible Expenditure incurred by the Recipient to deliver the Activities insofar as they address the specific needs of Victims of Crime.

The Recipient must follow the provisions on Eligible and Ineligible expenditure included in Paragraph 7 of the Agreement.

Apart from the changes set out above, the Agreement remains in full force and effect. Terms defined in the Agreement have the same meaning when used in this Grant Addendum Notice, unless defined otherwise.

This Grant Addendum Notice will be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of England and Wales and the Parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English and Welsh courts.

In considering whether to accept this Additional Funding, you should note that the Authority must be satisfied that your organisation has sufficient demand to ensure the Additional Funding can be spent on the Activities by the end of the Funding Period. Paragraph 6.22 of the Agreement states that the Recipient may not retain any portion of the Grant that has not been used by the end of the Funding Period without the Authority's written permission. If you are in any doubt about meeting these conditions you should consult the Authority before accepting.

Please confirm that you would like to accept the Additional Funding by returning a signed copy of this Grant Addendum Notice to <u>victimservicescommissioning@justice.gov.uk</u> by no later than 12 July 2023 (electronic copies are acceptable and are preferred).

The Parties acknowledge and agree that signature of this Grant Addendum Notice by the Recipient constitutes a Grant Claim for the Additional Funding.

Upon receipt, you will be issued with a copy of the Grant Addendum Notice signed on behalf of the Authority. The amendments shall take effect from the date that this Grant Addendum Notice is signed on behalf of the Authority.

RE: OFFER OF ADDITIONAL CORE GRANT FUNDING FOR 1 APRIL 2023 – 31 MARCH 2024

CORE GRANT FUNDING

Firstly, I want to extend my thanks for continuing to effectively commission vital victim support services. We are very grateful for your patience as we have finalised the 'Core uplift' funding budget for 2023/24, and I apologise for the delay in announcing the allocations.

The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) has more than quadrupled all its funding for victim and witness support services by 24/25, up from £41m in 2009/10, enabling commissioners to build resilience into services, safeguard consistent delivery and ensure support is available to victims when they need it. I am pleased that we have committed £154m of this budget per annum on a multi-year basis until the end of 24/25 (and overall £460m over the three years). PCC grant funding for core funding for services to support victims of all crime, specialist services for sexual violence and domestic abuse support, and the recruitment of independent sexual abuse and domestic violence advisors, has all been provided on a multiyear basis.

The Government is committed to ensuring that the right services are available for victims, that meet the needs of those who access them. In recognition of this commitment, the MoJ has agreed to a £2.3m uplift to the baseline 'core' PCC funding for 2023/24. This will mean that PCC collective 'core' funding for 2023/24 will be £71.5m. The total amount of victims funding allocated to PCCs is higher overall this year than last year's amount.

This letter constitutes a formal offer of additional grant funding by the Secretary of State for Justice to the Police and Crime Commissioner for Essex for the amount of £73,633.19 'Core' funding to commission local victim support services for the financial period from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024. This brings your total 'Core' funding for 23/24 to £2,223,446.27.
